# Christian Digital Radio and Television

## Premier.org.uk

Premier Christian Radio is perhaps the most well-known Christian radio station in the UK. Launched in 1994, originally as a London-only radio station, its service now includes a TV station – premier.tv - via its website.

Premier offers a wide range of programming that will appeal to Christians of all denominations. Shows include a popular breakfast programme hosted by John Panty and Cindy Kent, a women's show, daily worship, teaching and music shows plus a counselling programme.

Regular contributors include Joel Edwards, general secretary of the Evangelical Alliance and Joyce Meyer, a US evangelist.

The station's music output offers a broad mixture of Christian music, from classical music, modern and traditional worship to contemporary hip-hop, Gospel and jazz. The new addition to the station is its TV service, offering 1,600 videos, all free to view, and available to anyone with a broadband internet connection. Offering a wide array of television choices, including news, teaching, music, films, devotions and children's worship, Premier.tv has something for everyone.

Guests featured on the show include NT Wright, Linvoy Primus and Dr Tony Campolo. The service is quick to load and similar in many respects to the BBC's iPlayer service.

One of the easiest ways to listen to Premier Radio is thanks to digital television technology – the Christian station is available on Freeview, Virgin Media and Sky. If you have a broadband Internet connection, you can also listen via its website, [www.premier.org.uk](http://www.premier.org.uk). Selections of its programmes are also available via its on demand service. Premier is also a DAB station on the London multiplexes and, of course, you can also listen to the station via an old fashioned radio set if you live in London, on the Medium Wave bands of 1305, 1332 and 1413.

The Premier Christian Media Trust is also the publisher of Christianity, Youthwork and Faithworks magazines.

## Church in Scotland gets a taste of cafe service

A Borders restaurateur has decided to open up on Sundays on the advice of a Church of Scotland minister.

John Robertson, owner of Le Jardin in The Knowles, Kelso, said he was taken aback by the suggestion of the new opening time by the Rev Marion Dodd's idea.

He said: "I was very surprised that a minister of all people would ask us to open on the Sabbath, but after discussing it with my wife we decided to give it a shot and

follow pastoral advice."

Rev Dodd, of Kelso Old and Sprouston Parish Church, is a regular at Le Jardin who wanted her congregation to help the business out as trade quietened at the end of the tourist season.

She even stopped one of her Sunday morning services after the sermon to invite people to join her at the cafe and finish worship there.

Instead of having the usual collection,

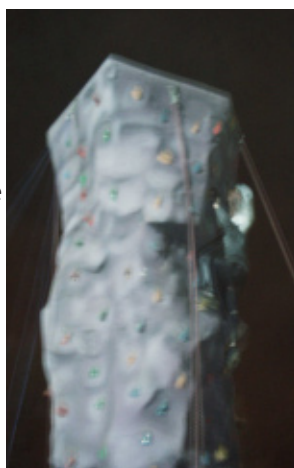
members of the congregation were encouraged to buy tea and cakes.
